mycelium /mai'si:liəm/

Mycelium is the vegetative part of a fungus or fungus-like bacterial colony, consisting of a mass of branching, thread-like hyphae.

Referred to as the 'wood wide web', mycelium serves as an underlying informational hub for entire ecosystems. It allows plants, trees and microbes to communicate over long distances and to exchange nutrients through the vast network of nodes in soil.

"I see the mycelium as the Earth's natural Internet, a consciousness with which we might be able to communicate. Through cross-species interfacing, we may one day exchange information with these sentient cellular networks. Because these externalized neurological nets sense any impression upon them, from footsteps to falling tree branches, they could relay enormous amounts of data regarding the movements of all organisms through the landscape."

biosemiotics /'baiəʊˌsi:mi'ptiks/

Biosemiotics is the study of signs, of communication, and of information exchange in ALL the living organisms, that goes beyond the constraints of spoken and written language.

Eco-critical biosemiotics in particular focus on language as a process of *poiesis* which looks at how beings bring forth their lifeworlds in dynamic conjunction with the lifeworlds of other entities.

"Instead of seeing trees as individual agents competing for resources, she proposed the forest as a 'co-operative system', in which trees 'talk' to one another, producing a collaborative intelligence described as 'forest wisdom'. Some older trees even 'nurture' smaller trees that they recognize as their 'kin', acting as 'mothers'."

panpsychism /pan'sAikiz(ə)m/

A philosophical view that asserts the existence of a proto-consciousness as a ubiquitous property of the universe, rather than something specific to human mind.

The socio-cultural theories of distributed consciousness are gradually being corroborated with findings from quantum-relativistic physics which increasingly lend support to formerly esoteric ideas such as the existence of infinite timeliness and parallel universes.

ecocene /'i:kəʊsi:n/

A proposed re-framing of our geological epoch that challenges anthropocentric modes of domination that arise from reductive and extractive ontologies.

It is an epoch in which humans use regenerative design which mimics the processes of nature to increase diversity, modularity, tightness of feedbacks, increasing redundancy, mutually supportive networks, self-regulation based on information and resource exchange within nested networks, the sharing of abundance.

"It may be that the new "environmental ethic" toward which so many environmental philosophers aspire—an ethic that would lead us to respect and heed not only the lives of our fellow humans but also the life and well-being of the rest of nature—will come into existence not primarily through the logical elucidation of new philosophical principles and legislative strictures, but through a renewed attentiveness to this perceptual dimension that underlies all our logics, through a rejuvenation of our carnal, sensorial empathy with the living land that sustains us."


solarpunk / səwləpank/
